Local residents invited to learn more, earn more, train for new jobs through Capital Region BOCES Adult & Continuing Ed courses

2010-11 catalog now available online, in print

Local residents are invited to learn more, earn more and train for new careers by enrolling in Adult & Continuing Education courses offered during the 2010-11 school year by the Capital Region BOCES Career & Technical School in Albany (Colonie) and Schoharie. Classes vary from one-night creative and personal development courses to career training in areas such as nursing and nurse assisting, welding, HVAC and heavy equipment operation.

BOCES Adult & Continuing Education courses include General Equivalency Diploma (GED), English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL), Practical Nursing and Nurse Assisting for Adult Students, ServSafe Food Safety, OSHA 10-hour Construction Certification, Welder Certification, training and certification in the operation of backhoes, mini excavators and forklifts, and HVAC Excellence, which is offered in partnership with Schenectady County Community College through a grant from the New York State Energy Research & Development Authority.

Personal development offerings include classes in artcycled mosaic glass and boxwood trees, Adobe Photoshop, culinary courses focused on the French Quarter and various world cultures, auto body repair, vehicle maintenance, basic home repair, and money management. Adult students may also enroll, on a space-available basis, in many of the Career & Technical Education programs that are offered to high school students from September through June.

“We’re proud to share the expertise and talent of our faculty and staff, whether it’s for career education, to earn a professional certification or GED, learn English as a second language, or just for personal enjoyment,” said Ray Paglieri, coordinator of adult education and special projects. “The cost is reasonable, the classes are open to persons age 18 or older, unless otherwise noted, and most are conveniently held at our BOCES Career & Tech School campuses on Watervliet-Shaker Road in Albany (Colonie) or route 30A in Schoharie, or at our Health Careers Center at Rosewood Plaza, 501 New Karner Road.”
