The community is invited to see what the Capital Region BOCES Career & Technical School has to offer learners of all ages and talents at Fall Open House on Wednesday, Oct. 27, from 6-8 p.m. at the school's Schoharie campus on Route 30A, just south of I-88, and on Thursday, Oct. 28, from 6-8 p.m. at the school's campus at 1015 Watervliet-Shaker Road, Colonie. Prior to each open house, at 5:30 p.m., campus chapter officers will be installed for SkillsUSA, a national organization of career and technical students.

The Open Houses will showcase student work, school offerings for high school students and adults, food and refreshments, campus tours and hands-on activities. The Capital Region Career & Technical School offers more than 40 programs of study, including one-year, two-year, college-credit-bearing, full-day and part-time study options. - Guided tours of campus by staff and students;

- Information about the off-campus New Visions programs for college-bound seniors;
- Information about the Theatre Technology program at Proctors Theatre, Schenectady; and
- Awareness- and fund-raising events to benefit the American Cancer Society led by the Cosmetology classes.

The Capital Region Career & Technical School is operated by the Capital Region Board of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES) enrolls more than 1,200 high school and adult students living in Albany, Schenectady, Schoharie and southern Saratoga counties.
