Summary: Explores the economic, political, and social changes caused by a maturing and increasingly diverse American population as well as the impact of a growing global economy. The program examines the foreign and domestic policies created under Bill Clinton, highlighting NAFTA, and discusses the scandal and impeachment trial during his second term.

Touching on the uncertainty surrounding the presidential election of 2000, the program introduces both candidates, George W. Bush and Al Gore. The last part of the program examines foreign policy and terrorism in America and abroad, specifically looking at George W. Bush's administration and handling of Osama bin Laden, al-Qaeda, and Saddam Hussein in Iraq following the September 11 attacks on the World Trade Center in New York City.
